US 34 Bridge Replacement Expected to Begin Construction *Traffic Control Expected*

Grand County, CO.- The Colorado Department of Transportation, in cooperation with Structures, Inc., moves forward with a bridge replacement on US 34 South of Grand Lake, Colorado. Bridge construction is expected to begin on Monday April 1st, 2019. Stages of work for this replacement project include detour construction onto a temporary bridge, the bridge replacement, asphalt paving, and detour removal and restoration.

TRAVEL IMPACTS:

Work will take place Monday through Friday, 7:00am to 6:00 pm. Traffic will be routed onto a temporary two-lane bridge with some single lane traffic control. Frequent single lane traffic may occur beginning in April through June. A periodic single lane closure will occur from June through September however will have no lane closures the week of 4th of July, and Friday through Tuesday of Memorial and Labor Day Weekends. Frequent single lane traffic may occur from September through October. Note that all lane closures are subject to weather and schedule changes due to unforeseen conditions. Speeds will be reduced in the construction zone to 25 mph during the project. Work on the project is expected to be completed this fall. All lane closures and traffic restrictions will be posted in advance.
